

# Dylan Campbell

The sport of baseball provides an opportunity to participate in a wholesome activity that fosters good sportsmanship, discipline, and fun. Dylan Campbell, the student-athlete baseball superstar, has a history of athletic excellence.

Dylan Campbell is the son of Andrea Odom and Donovan Campbell. Both parents were student-athletes at Texas Southern University. Andrea was a tennis player and Donovan played baseball. Donovan was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in 1988 and played four seasons in the Braves organization. He has one brother, Justin, and a sister, Ayden.

Dylan Campbell is a Junior Communication & Leadership major at The University of Texas. During high school at Strake Jesuit, Dylan was a three-sport athlete playing baseball, football, and basketball. Dylan started at shortstop for four years and was ranked No. 44 overall player in Texas and the 12th ranked shortstop in the state by Perfect Game.

During his senior year he was offered several scholarships for football and baseball but declined them all once he received his final offer and committed to sign at the University of Texas to play baseball. During his freshman and sophomore year, Dylan played a total of 97 games, starting 59 of them. As the starting right fielder for UT, this season he had a batting average of .339, 242 At Bats, 13 Home Runs, and 50 RBIs, and broke the university's consecutive game hitting streak with 38 hits, even breaking the Big 12 Conference record.

Dylan had a strong showing in the Regionals in Coral Gables, Florida and the Super Regionals in Palo Alto, California. Dylan is now weighing his options between returning for his final year of school or choosing to enter the MLB Draft next month.
